### From the Chair of the Director

Bright from the Start, through its Nutrition Services Division, has contracted with the University of Georgia's Department of Child and Family Development (UGA) to develop educational materials that address the problem of overweight children. UGA developed the curriculum unit "Eat Healthy, Be Active." It provides early childhood teachers with classroom activities designed to introduce children ages 3- 5 years to basic health concepts and encourage good nutrition and physical activity habits. The curriculum includes 14 different activities that can be incorporated into all areas of the early childhood classroom including science, art, outdoor play, dramatic play, music, language arts, and large group activities. Copies of the curriculum and accompanying resource kits can be checked out at your local Child Care Resource and Referral Agency.

# 4 Menu Planning Tips

- #1 Variety— Plan at least 3 weeks of menus at a time. This will prevent the problem of repeating foods too often.
- **#2 Color** Include a variety of colors in each meal and/or snack. This will provide a variety of vitamins and minerals. It will also create eye appeal, which promotes healthy eating.
- #3 Texture- Include food that is crunchy, chewy, and smooth. Textures add interest to a meal.
- #4 Arrangement Pay attention to how food is arranged on the plate. It should look delicious and appealing!

## **CACFP Policy Updates and Guidance**

### New and revised memos have been issued for CACFP participants since the last newsletter

### Changes in Eligibility for Emergency/Homeless Shelters

Previously, emergency shelters that were eligible to participate in the CACFP had to provide temporary housing and food services to children and their families. Federal guidance now allows institutions that serve children unaccompanied by an adult to participate in the CACFP as well. Residential child care institutions (RCCIs) may participate in the CACFP if they operate a separate program for homeless children, or families with children.

### Media Releases

Each year during the application renewal period, Bright from the Start will issue a statewide media release on behalf of all institutions currently participating in the CACFP. However, all new institutions are required to issue their own media release, and sponsoring organizations must issue a media release for any newly sponsored facilities.

### Free and Reduced Price Meal Eligibility Determinations

Households are no longer required to report these changes in their circumstances: an increase in income, a decrease in household size, or if the household is no longer eligible for food stamps or TANF during the period covered by the eligibility statement. Once correctly approved for free or reduced price benefits, a household will remain eligible for those benefits for a period of no more than 12 months. However, this change does not modify the requirement to obtain an updated Income Eligibility Statement (IES) after 45 days for the households who have indicated "no" or "zero" income to qualify.

When reviewing the food stamp case number on the IES, a valid case number will either be nine or four digits long. The EBT number (number on the card used to make purchases) is not an acceptable number. If a 16 digit number is reported on the IES, you must have the household member review their paperwork and report the AU or Client ID number, or if it is not corrected, the IES must be placed in the "Paid" category.

### Household Contact Requirements (Sponsoring Organizations only)

The memorandum dated 9/18/06 was revised to provide additional clarification for conducting Household contacts. This memo specifically states when sponsors are required to make contacts, the deadline for making these contacts, and how many contacts must be made. The memo rescinds the previous Household Contact memo dated January 5, 2006.

### Block Claiming Follow-up Review Guidance (Sponsoring Organizations only)

Another memorandum dated 9/18/06 was also revised to provide guidance on conducting unannounced follow up reviews within 60 days after the submission of a block claim by a sponsored facility. The memo rescinds the previous Block Claiming Follow up Review Guidance memo dated January 5, 2006.
