• Preliminary Summer 2017 Results •



Thank you for your hard work this summer! We commend you for your dedication to ensuring Georgia's youngest citizens had access to healthy, free meals this summer. You provided a critical resource for abating childhood hunger during the summer. Due to your efforts, the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) grew in many areas in 2017.

In conjunction with the Department of Education, the program expanded in three of six targeted counties. Children were served at sites in Haralson, McIntosh, and Taliaferro counties – counties that had no meal service the previous year. Additionally, we saw a 5.5% increase in sites across the state. Your hard work also resulted in 66 library sites this year, an increase of 35% year over year! Your concerted efforts resulted in just under 5.4 million meals and snacks served through the SFSP during summer 2017!

We appreciate your diligence and dedication in realizing this growth. We will continue to update you on summer 2017 results as final numbers come in.

Early Language and Literacy Mini-Grant Program

The Governor's Office of Student Achievement (GOSA) recently announced the launch of the Early Language and Literacy Mini-Grant Program to invest in community partnerships to support efforts to build early literacy skills in young students.

The Early Language and Literacy Mini-Grant Program is designed to support collaborative partnerships in projects targeting birth to age eight language and literacy development needs. These community partnerships may include child care facilities, public and private Pre-Ks, primary grades of elementary schools, local service agencies, and local nonprofits. The program is a joint effort of GOSA and the Sandra Dunagan Deal Center for Early Language and Literacy at Georgia College.

Grants from \$5,000 to \$20,000 will be awarded to support innovative projects that develop or strengthen community initiatives targeting at least one of the four pillars of the Get Georgia Reading Campaign: Language Nutrition, Access, Positive Learning Climate, and Teacher Preparation and Effectiveness.
