WHO WE ARE

The Georgia Foundation for Early Care and Learning is an independent 501(c)3 that supports the efforts of the Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning (DECAL). In 2017, the Georgia General Assembly passed legislation allowing the nonprofit to form. Shortly after Governor Nathan Deal signed the legislation into law, the nonprofit was formed and began making strategic investments to improve and expand high-quality education.

OUR MISSION

To support access to high quality early childhood education to Georgia's youngest learners and their families, providers, and teachers through established strategic investments, collaborations and partnerships in order to drive Georgia's current and future workforce.

OUR VISION

To provide the best beginnings possible for all of Georgia's children.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

Research has shown that every dollar invested in high-quality early education saves, on average, \$13 later in reduced crimes rates, lower demand for social services, and increased tax revenues. Investing in early childhood education is vital to the success and stability of individuals and our community.

OUR STRATEGIC INVESTMENTS

The Georgia Foundation for Early Care + Learning's mission is to **support access to high quality early childhood education** to Georgia's youngest learners and their families, providers, and teachers through **established strategic investments**, **collaborations and partnerships** in order to **drive Georgia's current and future workforce**.

HIGH-IMPACT Nonprofit

100% of all funds raised by the Foundation go directly to the programs we support.

COVID-19 RELIEF & Recovery grants

Due to the devestating pandemic in 2020, the Foundation provided over \$250,000 to child care providers and families by addressing two critical needs: child care scholarships for children of essential workers and financial assistance for child care providers.

TWO-GENERATION IMPLEMENTATION

The Foundation supported the implementation of Two-Gen strategies by co-hosting a 3day training conference and purchasing over 200 Family-Centered Coaching Toolkits for DECAL's front line staffers and case managers.

GEORGIA'S PRE-K TEACHERS OF THE YEAR

The Foundation supported Georgia's Pre-K Teacher of the Year Program which highlights and rewards outstanding teachers across the state. This \$20,000 program awards teachers with classroom makeovers and individual grants as they serve as DECAL ambassadors showcasing best practices in the profession.

TRAININGS & PARTNERSHIPS

The Foundation supported research and training programs by partnering with Voices for Georgia's Children and Quality Rated to create pilot programs involving family child care providers and after-school programs, respectively.

A MESSAGE FROM CARRIE ASHBEE, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

As we reflect back on State Fiscal Year 2020, ending on June 30, some might find it difficult to recall anything that happened before the public health crisis. Life as we knew it completely changed around the world in March of 2020 and we all have been left to cope with the aftermath of this pandemic.

The Foundation had to adjust like every other nonprofit, business, school or family. Several new programs had to be put on hold such as the Statewide Infant-Toddler Teacher Initiative conference or the inaugural Georgia Early Childhood Educator of the Year Program. However, the year of the pandemic is far from lost. In fact, there are many bright spots found throughout the entire year!

The Foundation partnered with several Georgia nonprofits such as Voices for
