Georgia's Preschool Development Grant

In December 2019, Georgia was **one of 20 states** awarded a Preschool Development Grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and U.S. Department of Education.

Georgia was awarded **\$11.2** M over three years.

This funding builds on the initial \$2.9 M initial grant received in January 2019.
