



Exemptions Newsletter - Winter 2020



A representative from your local public health department may visit or contact your child care program sometime this year to review the immunization records for the children in your care.

According to the Georgia Department of Public Health Rules (Chapter 290-5-4), any child attending a school or child care program must present proof that their immunization records are current. The proof is Certificate of Immunization (Form 3231), which must be kept on file and available for inspection by authorized health officials.

Exemption Category Refresher



Exemption Category 6: Nursery schools, playschools, kindergartens or other educational programs for children two (2) years through six (6) years of age that operate for no more than four (4) consecutive hours per day.

Programs are for children ages 2-6, up to 4 hours each day, cannot be combined with other categories for the same children attending.
