#### Vision:

Georgia will be a national leader in *recognizing* and *committing to* accountable early learning systems for the state's infant and toddler population.

#### Mission:

Support infants and toddlers by providing Georgia's families and early care and education professionals with *multi-faceted and* culturally responsive resources that support children's physical, social, emotional, cognitive, and language development.



#### **2013 GAPITC Statistics**



- GAPITC Conferences
  - 1,797 Participants
- January June
  - 3,947 children served
  - 695 teachers
  - 1,515 hours
  - 342 site visits

### **Mentor Training**



- Phase One/Year One:
  - > 25 participants
  - Three sessions
    - Session 1 Introduction to the statewide system and introduction of mentor competencies
    - Session 2 Three attributes needed for effective mentoring (knowledge, disposition, administrative support)
    - Session 3 Designing a mentor system for individual programs, individualized goals



#### **Technical Assistance**



- Eight Technical Assistance Specialists
  - > 80 sites
  - Average of two site visits per site per month
  - ➤ Mini-grant package (\$3,000 value) per site
  - Pre and post assessment using ITERS-R/FCCERS-R
- Technical assistance is based on:
  - Licensing rules and regulations
  - ➤ ITERS-R/FCCERS-R guidelines
  - Program for Infant and Toddler Care (PITC)
  - Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS)
