Music and Movement

Listen and Move

Freeze Dance

Challenge: Turn off the screen and have your child follow along to audio only.

Phonological Awareness

Sing Twinkle Twinkle Little Star with your child and ask him to listen for words that rhyme or sound alike at the end. Sing the song again and have your child point out rhyming words. Add movement to the activity by asking your child to jump or put his hands in the air when he hears a rhyming word.

Writing

Discuss with your child the uses of maps. If you have any maps, show them to your child. Help your child create a map of your home and label the different parts of it. Add a math component to the activity by helping your child count the steps between the rooms in your house and include that information on the map.

Math

Shape Hunt: Go on a shape hunt around your house. Call out a shape and have your child find two or three objects that match the shape you named. Have her draw the different objects she found. Do this for several different shapes such as circle, triangle, square and rectangle.

Recycling Sort: Talk to your child about the importance of recycling materials in your home. Collect materials as you use them (this may take a few days) and put them into a separate bin. Work with your child to sort these objects by paper, cardboard, and plastic and have her count the items in each category.

Discuss which type material for which there was more or less.

Fine Motor

Collect a colander/strainer and pipe cleaners (or uncooked spaghetti noodles). Have your child practice pushing pipe cleaners from one side of the colander to the other.

Challenge: Create a thick layer of pipe cleaners and see what objects will rest on top of the woven pipe cleaners without falling through to the bottom.
