Phonological Awareness

Clap the syllables in these words: flower, rose, daffodil, daisy, geranium, tulip, mum, petunia.

Literacy

Read aloud **[The Tiny Seed](#)** by Eric Carle. After reading the story, ask your child, “How many seeds started to grow in the ground during the spring?” “What smashed the seed?” “Why couldn’t it grow anymore?” “Which seed grew faster?” “What happened to the bigger flower?” “What happened to the little seed during the summer?” “How tall did the flower grow?” “Who visited the flower as it grew all summer?” “What happened to the flower and seeds when it became autumn again?”

Fine Motor

Get hands-on and dirty!

One of the best ways to develop hand strength is for a child to make his hand into a fist over and over - this works many muscles in the hand and forearm. A fun way to build these muscles is to go outside and have your child pick up handfuls of dirt, and crush it all up in his hands, let it drop to the ground, and repeat. Kids like this activity and it certainly builds up the muscles they use in handwriting!

Science

Watch this **[Seed Germination](#)** to see how a seed is germinated (how it grows). You can extend your child’s understanding by planting a seed with your child and watching it grow. Encourage your child to draw a picture of the changes in the plant every few days and discuss what he notices.
