Phonological Awareness

Clap the syllables in the names of these fruits: apple, banana, pear, strawberry, orange, peach.

Clap the syllables in the names of these vegetables: potato, broccoli, bean, carrots, corn, and onion.

Literacy

PLANTS FEED ME by Lizzy Rockwell describes which parts of plants are edible. Ask your child to name the leaves, roots, fruits and seeds that she likes to eat.

Math

Look in your pantry or refrigerator and challenge your child to count how many items you have that originated from a plant. These are your fruits and vegetables. After counting the items, have your child sort them into a group of fruits and a group of vegetables.

Science and Fine Motor

Brainstorm with your child to generate a list of plants you eat.

Think about root plants, vines, trees, and those that grow on top of the ground.

Your child can also draw a picture of each of the fruits and vegetables listed and write the name beside the picture.

Root plants include carrots, radishes, beets, potatoes, and sweet potatoes.

Vines provide pumpkins, zucchini, tomatoes, strawberries, and beans.

Trees are where apples, pears, oranges, peaches, and plums grow.

Lettuce, spinach, cabbage, and Brussel sprouts grow on top of the ground.
