On the Move

Feed the Baby Birds

The baby birds are starving, can you help feed them?

Materials:

- Toilet paper tubes
- Tape
- Feathers
- Paper
- Glue
- Pipe cleaners
- Scissors

Instructions:

1. Cut two triangles from the paper and tape them to the top edge of the toilet paper tube, creating a beak.
2. Cover the bottom half of the tube with glue and attach feathers.
3. Cut pipe cleaners into small, "worm-sized" pieces.
4. Have your toddler pick up and drop the worms into the mouths of the baby birds. You can add tweezers or tongs for added fun.

Digging for Worms

The early bird always gets the worm. How many worms can you find?

Materials:

- Bin
- Dirt/sand
- Plastic worms/bugs
- Shovels/tongs

Instructions:

1. Add plastic worms/bugs to bin and cover with dirt/sand.
2. Pour water into the bin to create a muddy mess.
3. Using shovels or tongs, have your child to dig through the mud to find all of the worms & bugs.

Turkey on a Roll

Why not save your rolls and make a turkey!

Materials:

- Toilet paper roll/paper towel roll cut in half
- Construction paper/white paper
- Scissors
- Crayons/markers
- Glue

Instructions:

1. Cut out circles for the turkey's eyes & triangles for the turkey's beak. If you do not have construction paper color your eyes and beak.
2. Cut out a strip of red paper for the turkey's gobbler or color a strip of paper red.
3. Trace your hands for the turkey's feathers & color them in various colors.
4. Glue your eyes, beak, & gobbler to your toilet paper roll.
5. Glue your hands in the back of the roll for the feathers.
6. Find a space in your home to hang your "Turkey on a Roll".
