

# Transportation Activities for Monday

## On the Move

### Name Road Tracing

Learn letter recognition and build fine motor skills with this motor-themed tracing game.

Materials:

- Paper
- Crayons
- Scissors
- Small Car or Truck

Instructions:

1. Draw the letters in your child's name as block letters (make sure they are large enough to fit the car/truck of your choosing along the inside of each letter)
2. Cut out each letter
3. Draw road lines around the center of each letter
4. Lay out the letters on a cleared space or surface in your home
5. Have your child roll their vehicles along each letter
6. Talk about the letter as they play with it- what sounds does it make?

## Sensory Time

### Making Tracks

Vehicles make tracks wherever they go!

Materials:

- Play dough
- Child safe vehicles

Instructions:

1. Help your child make a flat "pancake" out of the playdough.
2. Have your child roll their vehicles over the play dough to make tire tracks.
3. Talk about the different tracks the different vehicles make- are they big or little, bumpy or smooth?

## *Arts and Creativity*

### **Drive and Draw**

A fun way to draw with cars!

Materials:

- Markers or crayons
- Tape
- Toy cars, trucks, or any vehicle with wheels.
- Paper or cardboard

Instructions:

1. Attach a marker or crayon, tip side down, to the back of the vehicle with tape.
2. Tape the paper or cardboard to a table or tray
3. Show your child how they can draw on the paper by moving the vehicle.
4. After your child has drawn with their vehicle, remove the marker or crayon and your child can drive their car on the lines that they drew.
