#### **Winter Clothing Sort**

Materials:

- Various Winter Clothing Items: Socks, Gloves/Mittens, Jackets, Coats, Hats, etc.
- Large Containers or Laundry Baskets
- Paper
- Marker
- Tape

Instructions:

- Create labels for the baskets by drawing/writing each item on a separate piece of paper.
- Tape the labels to the baskets/containers and line them up in front of your winter clothing pile.
- Ask your toddler to sort the items into their separate baskets.

### **Paper Plate Hat**

Enjoy creating your own hat

#### Materials

- paper plate
- glue
- construction paper or paper
- markers, crayons, or paint
- scissors
- cotton balls (optional)

#### Directions

- Cut your paper plate in half or you can fold it over & glue its edges together to make your hat look 3-D.
- Decorate your hat with markers, crayons, or paint (if you have stickers, you can use those as well)
- use your construction paper (paper) to cut out shapes to glue on your hat
- At the bottom of your hat glue cotton balls along the bottom as well as the top of your hat. (optional)

If you do not want to use cotton balls at the bottom of your hat, cut out a strip of paper and glue it at the bottom of your hat. (optional)
