On the Move

Shape Roads

All roads lead to shapes!

Materials:

- Paper
- Crayons
- Tape
- Small cars or trucks

Instructions:

1. Cut strips of paper which should be big enough to construct the sides of your desired shapes.
2. Tape the strips together to form shapes (triangles, squares, rectangles, etc.)
3. Draw/color street lines along the strips to resemble roads.
4. Provide your child with a toy car and ask them to roll the car along the "shape roads".

Sensory Time

Shape Sorting

Fun comes in all shapes and sizes.

Materials:

- Colored paper
- Colored tape
- Scissors
- Marker

Instructions:

1. Use the tape to make large shapes (squares, rectangles, diamonds, triangles, etc.) on the floor.
2. Cut colored paper into small shapes to correlate with the ones on the floor.
3. Use the marker to label the shapes on the floor.
4. Have your child place the small shapes onto the shapes on the floor to match the shapes together.

Materials:

- Paper
- Scissors
- Glue

Instructions:

1. Cut out all types of shapes (circle, square, triangle, rectangle, diamonds) for your child.
2. Have your child use the glue to place their shapes on their paper.
3. Ask your child to name all their shapes in their collage and pick a place in your home to hang their masterpiece.
