#### What is associative play?



Associative play is when two or more children play with similar toy sets. The children may share toys and talk to each other about their play.

## Why is associative play important?

- Children can learn social skills by talking with each other and sharing toys
- Children begin to take interest in what other children are doing
- Children can learn more complex play and social behaviors by observing peers

### How can adults support associative play?

- Provide opportunities for the child to play alongside other children

- Make comments about the play activity
- Encourage sharing of the play materials
- Provide the child with time and space to engage in associative play

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
