



What to do first.....Affirmation



- Complete the Affirmation of Lawful Presence online in PANDA
 - Required ONLY for child care learning programs operating as a corporation
 - Required prior to issuance of grant agreement
 - Carefully review the options
 - Select the appropriate option

What to do first...Pre-K Grant Agreements



- Grant agreements are emailed through the PANDA system. Newly funded classes will receive two grant agreements in two separate emails.
- Start-Up Funds Grant Agreement:
 - Each new classroom funded received \$8,000 per class for furniture, equipment and supplies
 - ONLY received if there are new/expansion classes funded
- Pre-K Program Grant Agreement:
 - Includes numbers of classes/children to be served
 - Estimated budget based on number of classes
 - Funding received will be prorated based on student enrollment and teacher credentials

What to do first...Pre-K Grant Agreements



- Print 2 copies of each grant agreement received.
- Contract signatory must sign both copies.
- Mail both originals to DECAL.
- One copy of each grant agreement will be mailed back for your files.


What's Next?... Operating Guidelines



- Pre-K Providers' Operating Guidelines are updated annually and will be available on the DECAL website for download on July 1st.
- Project directors should read and become familiar with the guidelines to ensure that their program is operating within the guidelines and in compliance with grant requirements.

 - Submission dates
 - Teacher credential and salary requirements

What's Next?.... Understanding Pre-K Funding



- Your Pre-K grant funding is based on several cost drivers including:
 - Program type: public or private
 - Region: metro or non-metro
 - Lead teacher credential: bachelor or certified
 - Student enrollment
- Funding is paid in 10 monthly payments beginning in August.

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



























- The Rate Chart represents a 'per class' reimbursement. It does not give an exact reimbursement amount.
- The 'per class' estimate is based on the FY2019 Pre-K budget.
- Payment calculations for operating costs are based on student enrollment and the lead teacher credentials.
- The actual class reimbursement amount may vary based on program data including:
 - Changes in class size
 - Changes in lead teacher credential
 - # of days offering service
- Payments for lead and assistant teacher salaries are based on the salary rates reflected in the Pre-K Providers' Operating Guidelines.



- The Rate Chart itemizes the core costs of the program (salary and operating) by the budget cost drivers (program type and service area, lead teacher credential level).
- Reimbursement is impacted by additional factors NOT represented on the Rate Chart:
 - Transportation services provided for Category 1 students
 - Start up funds for newly funded classes
 - Supplemental Compensation for Lead Teachers

Understanding the Rate Chart- Core Costs





Salary Requirements



- Lead teacher salary will have two components:
 - Base salary determined by credential level
 - Supplemental compensation determined by Creditable Years of Experience.
- Compensation must meet the following minimum salary requirements:
 - Lead Teacher:
 - 90% of the base salary
 - 100% of supplemental compensation
 - Assistant Teacher:
 - 100% of salary

Lead Teacher Supplemental Compensation



Supplemental compensation is funded for all Pre-K lead teachers (public and private programs).

3% for each 2 years of Creditable Years of Experience up to 20 years.

Creditable Years of Experience



- Programs will be responsible for determining valid Creditable Years of Experience (CYE) for each teacher.
 - Programs should develop policy and process for verification.
- A PANDA email will be sent notifying providers when the roster system is open for teacher data entry.
- Data entry made prior to August 1st will be used to calculate lead teacher base salary and supplemental compensation for the August payment.
- It is critical that lead teacher information be accurate.

What's Next?...Setting Program Calendar



- 2018 2019 School Year Requirements
 - 180 instructional days for students
 - 6.5 hours per day
 - Equivalent 1170 hours of instruction

- 10 additional days for teaching staff
 - These days should be used for professional development and/or staff planning days.

Calendar Submission



- Calendars are submitted through PANDA.
- Deadline for calendar submission is August 1st.
- Include the following:
 - 180 student instructional days
 - 10 teacher Professional Development/ Planning Days
 - Begin & end dates for students
 - Program closure days
- Calendar will be reviewed and approved.
- Confirmation of approval will be received through email.

What's next?... Hiring Teaching Staff




Teacher Requirements

- Lead Teacher
 - Early Childhood Education or ECE Related Bachelor's Degree OR
 - Certified (T4) or Certified Masters (T5) by Georgia Professional Standards Commission (GaPSC)
- Assistant Teacher
 - Valid Paraprofessional Certificate OR
 - Valid Child Development Associate (CDA) Credential or Technical Certificate (TCC) or (TCD)
 - Refer to Guidelines for complete list of accepted credentials.


Professional Development System (GaPDS)



Lead teachers that are qualified to serve will see Qualifies for GA Pre-K Lead in the Account Information Summary.



Assistant teachers must have a GaPDS Career Level of 4 or higher.



What's Next?... Registering Students



- Child registration forms are on the website under *Project Director* tab.
- Eligibility Requirements for Students:
 - Age Requirement
 - 4 years old on or before September 1, 2018
 - Documentation required prior to attendance
 - Residency Requirement
 - Georgia Resident
 - Documentation required prior to attendance

- Start-up Funds
 - Start-up Grant Agreement sent via email
 - Sign and return 2 copies
 - \$8,000 start-up funds per new class
- Use the Georgia's Pre-K Program Basic Equipment, Materials, and Supplies Inventory List (Appendix H)
 - Start-up purchases require prior Pre-K consultant approval


What's Next?...Selecting Curricula



- All Pre-K Programs are required to select an approved curriculum from the approved curricula list.
- The approved list and information guides for each curriculum are available on the DECAL website.
- Submit a Request for Curriculum Change form (Appendix G) to your Pre-K consultant.
- While ordering a curriculum, let the vendor know that you are a Georgia's Pre-K Program as there may be discounts or special training available to you.

In response to the recent revision and implementation of the Georgia Early Learning and Development Standards (GELDS), DECAL initiated a curriculum review for Georgia's Pre-K Program and Georgia's birth to five early learning programs. The purpose of the Georgia curriculum review and approval process is to identify curriculum models that best support Georgia's early learning programs and are optimally aligned with the Georgia Early Learning and Development Standards (GELDS). The process resulted in an approved curriculum list for Georgia's Pre-K Programs. A recommended curriculum list for Georgia's birth to five early learning programs is coming soon.

In the document list below, DECAL has included one-page summaries of all approved curriculum. These summaries should be used as a resource as providers make decisions regarding curriculum.
