Federal Reporting Data 2018 fiscal year (July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018)

Beginning October 1, 2018 the Lead Agency's definition of serious injury is defined for licensed providers as:

A death or an incident requiring hospitalization or professional medical attention other than first aid of a child while in the care of the provider that that was the result of a substantiated intentional or gross negligent act on behalf of the provider and or staff that indicates a deficiency in the operation and or management of the program. Any case of serious injury that was substantiated by the Lead Agency will be deemed as Extreme Harm and Imminent Danger according to the Lead Agency's Integrated Enforcement and Compliance System. Future published aggregate data will be based on this definition.

While the Lead Agency did not have an adopted definition for serious injury/incident prior to October 1, 2018, Child Care Services definition used in reporting for previous CCDF State Plans was defined as an incident or accident that occurred and resulted in substantiated rule violations in licensed Child Care Centers and Family Child Care Learning Homes. The aggregate data being reported below for FY18 is based on the definition under the previous CCDF State Plan. In future years, the data will be reported based on the adoption of the October 1, 2018 definition as stated above.
