Daily Meal Count Form for Rural Non-Congregate Sites Now Available

Based on your feedback, we have created a **Rural Non-Congregate Daily Meal Count Form that sponsors may use when approved to serve non-congregate meals**. As a reminder, each meal must be crossed off individually as it is provided—attendance sheets, pre-orders, or estimates cannot be used.

This form allows multiple meal types to be captured on a single form (e.g., if Breakfast and Lunch are provided at the same time, both meal types can be captured on this single form). The form also captures key details such as multi-day or bulk meal distribution, intended consumption dates, meals prepared, carryover meals, and the maximum meal counts approved in your Site Application.

Use of this form is optional. Sponsors may continue to use the traditional Daily Meal Count form.

Happy Helpings Sponsors are required to display the “And Justice for All” poster at meal sites where it can be viewed by the public.

You can download the poster [here](#), and display it in the specific size of 11” width x 17” height. The cost for printing posters is an approved Happy Helpings expense and should be allocated to the publication, printing, and reproduction budget line item.

Navigating the SFSP Application: Tips for a Successful Submission

With the SFSP application deadline having passed on May 15, sponsors should ensure all remaining application items are complete, accurate, and submitted as soon as possible to help avoid delays in processing and approval.

Tips for Completing the Application

- Applications submitted after the May 15 deadline may experience delays in processing and approval.
- To minimize confusion, only the program contact and/or authorized representative should communicate with the application reviewer.
- The program contact is responsible for entering all information into the online application system, GA ATLAS.
- Complete all forms in their entirety—missing information can delay approval.
- Submit a signed Food Service Permit Inquiry Form for each county where meals will be served before submitting your application to DECAL.
- If using (or acting as) a Food Service Management Company (FSMC), ensure Questions 42 and 43 on the institution application are completed accurately.

Board of Directors Section

- Ensure all required sections are completed for each board member.
- Any changes to the Board of Directors (BOD) must be supported with board meeting minutes.
- Confirm the “Delegation of Authority” form is signed by a board officer (as defined on the form).

Budget

Specific Prior Written Approval (SPWA) Submission and Approval Process
For emergency requests:

- Email the SPWA request form and supporting documentation to Gwendolyn.Howard@decalf.ga.gov within 24 hours of purchase.
- Submit a budget revision to include the cost.

For all other requests:

- Submit a budget revision including the cost.
- Upload the SPWA request form and supporting documents in GA ATLAS.
- Notify the budget team at Nutritionbudget@dec.al.ga.gov at least three days before making the purchase.

DECAL will review and provide written approval or denial. Approved SPWAs will be uploaded to GA ATLAS.

Site Application

- Site changes, including add-a-sites, must be approved before making changes to an approved budget.
- Indicate any non-operating days in Question #14.
- If the site is outdoors, include a detailed indoor contingency plan in Question #28.

Maximum Meal Count (MMC)

- The standard MMC threshold is 100 meals per site.

Before Initial Approval:

- Requests above 100 meals must include written justification submitted to your Application Specialist.

Acceptable justification includes:

- Enrollment or registration documentation for closed enrolled sites
- Letters of authorization for unaffiliated schools or apartment communities

No justification required if:

- Requesting the same previously approved MMC, or
- Requesting below a previously approved threshold

Requesting an Increase After Operations Begin

- Submit written justification to your Business Operations Specialist
- Provide three consecutive days of Daily Meal Count (DMC) forms
- Document any additional children requesting meals after all meals are served

Important Reminders

- Sponsors are not required to serve meals beyond the approved MMC.
- If an MMC increase is not approved, the sponsor is responsible for any excess meal costs.
- All MMC increase requests must be approved before submitting your monthly claim.

Updating Your Banking Info? Complete the Supplier Change Request Form

Anytime you change your bank account information, notify DECAL by completing the Supplier Change Request (SCR) Form and submitting it to your organization's assigned Application Specialist.

The State Accounting Office (SAO) Vendor Management Group (VMG) has an extensive process for verifying the bank accounts of any individual or organization for which payments are made. This is to prevent fraudulent banking and payments. Therefore, any updates made to your existing banking information may take up to four to five weeks to process.

Below are updates to the vendor management process:

- The SAO has issued a new [Supplier Change Request \(SCR\) Form](#) and [Instructions](#) that must be used.
- The SAO is now requiring the supplier to enter the "county" on the Supplier Change SCR Form after the address.
- The SCR Form must have a recent date by the vendor's signature. Electronic signatures will not be accepted on the SCR Form. It must be a wet signature or digital signature with date. Recent date means less than 60 days.
- The VMG will no longer accept voided checks or official bank letter for bank verification.

- **W9's** must be submitted using the March 2024 version. The version date is located in the top left and bottom right of the form. W9's must have an IRS specified recent date of 365 days or less (ex. If today is November 18, 2024, the earliest valid date is November 18, 2023.) Electronic signatures are NOT acceptable on the W9. It must be a wet signature or digital signature with date.
- W9's for businesses must be completed exactly as the IRS has the company name listed on their tax returns. Both DECAL and SAO verify Tax ID and Name combinations using IRS software. DECAL will not honor requests to setup new vendors where the Tax ID and Name combination does not match IRS records.

Adding New Sites After Application Approval?

If you have added new sites after your initial application was approved, your program expenses may have increased. If so, you must submit a budget revision to reflect the additional costs associated with operating the new sites.

Before submitting a budget revision, ensure all Add-A-Site information has been submitted to your assigned Business Operations Specialist and approved. Once the new sites are approved, your updated budget costs will be reviewed for consideration and approval.

Help Kids Stay Hydrated in the Summer Heat

Summer in Georgia brings sunshine, long days, and lots of active play for children, but it also brings high temperatures and humidity that can quickly lead to dehydration. As outdoor temperatures rise, making hydration a daily priority is essential for children's health and comfort.

Keep water easily accessible and plan regular water breaks every 15–20 minutes during outdoor play. Since children, especially younger children, may not recognize when they need fluids, offer water frequently and watch closely for signs of dehydration.

To make water more fun and appealing, try infusing it with fresh fruits, vegetables, or herbs for a naturally refreshing drink.

Hydration doesn't come from water alone. Milk and many foods also help meet fluid needs. Choose "juicy" fruits and vegetables such as cucumbers, zucchini, iceberg lettuce, celery, tomatoes, watermelon, cantaloupe, strawberries, oranges, grapes, peaches, and grapefruit.

While Happy Helpings sites are encouraged to make safe drinking water freely accessible to children throughout the day, water is **not** a reimbursable meal component in the SFSP.

Knowing the signs of [dehydration in children](#) can help providers act early. If symptoms do not improve, or you notice signs of severe dehydration, call 911 or seek emergency care.

Celebrate Farm to Summer Week



DECAL’s Nutrition Services will celebrate **Farm to Summer Week** from June 22–26, highlighting how child nutrition programs can connect children to Georgia’s summertime agricultural abundance through fresh, locally sourced foods and hands-on learning experiences.

Through fun activities like gardening, cooking, taste testing, and agriculture-based learning, Farm to Summer improves the quality and appeal of summer meals while keeping children nourished, active, and excited about healthy foods, all while supporting Georgia farmers and local communities.

Each day of the week features a special theme designed to inspire learning and creativity:

- **Monday – What is Farm to Summer:** Introduce children to the concept of Farm to Summer and explore how food travels from the farm to their plates.
- **Tuesday – Gardening & Physical Activity:** Get moving with garden-based activities that teach how food grows while encouraging physical activity.
- **Wednesday – Cooking & Taste Testing:** Involve children in preparing and tasting fresh fruits and vegetables to build healthy habits and curiosity around food.
- **Thursday – Locally Grown in Meals & Snacks:** Highlight Georgia-sourced foods in meals and snacks and discuss the importance of supporting local farmers.
- **Friday – Literacy, Music & Movement:** Wrap up the week with farm-themed books, songs, and movement activities that make learning about food fun and memorable.

We encourage all Happy Helpings operators to participate by incorporating these themes into your activities throughout the week. Whether it’s planting an herb in a container children can take home and care for with their families, hosting a taste test featuring Georgia-grown fruits and vegetables like peaches, strawberries, tomatoes, or okra, or reading a farm-, gardening-, or cooking-themed story, every activity helps children build a stronger connection to healthy food and where it comes from.

Turnip the Beet Award

Recognizing Excellence in Summer Meals

The Turnip the Beet Award is a national recognition from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) that honors outstanding summer meal program sponsors who go above and beyond to serve high-quality, nutritious, and appealing meals to children during the summer.

This award highlights programs that provide well-balanced meals that are nutritious and enjoyable, help encourage participation, and support child nutrition when school is not in session. Strong



programs often include a variety of fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and locally sourced foods when available.

Winning programs often feature:

- Serving fresh, locally grown fruits and vegetables
- Incorporating feedback from children through taste tests
- Hosting educational and physical activities alongside meal service

All summer meal sponsors in good standing are eligible and may self-nominate or be nominated. Stay tuned for upcoming application details.

Policy Guidance for Happy Helpings Sponsors

Incorporating Local Beef into Child Nutrition Program (CNP) Meals

This memorandum encourages interested CNP operators, ranchers, and beef vendors to connect. CNP operators, local beef producers, and vendors should focus on identifying opportunities that make local beef sales and purchases a win for all operations involved.

Appropriations Act Effect on Child Nutrition Programs

This memorandum provides notice to (CNP) operators regarding the Continuing Appropriations, Agriculture, Legislative Branch, Military Construction and Veterans Affairs, and Extensions Act, 2026 (Public Law 119-37, the 2026 Appropriations Act), enacted on November 12, 2025.

This memorandum applies to state agencies administering and local organizations operating USDA, Food and Nutrition Service CNPs. Specific to CACFP and Happy Helpings, this guidance explains that Program funds may not be used to procure raw or processed poultry or seafood products imported into the United States from the People's Republic of China, and that this prohibition (applied to all CNPs) remains effective through September 30, 2026.

Unanticipated School Closure Waivers

Waivers Available Through June 30

On July 30, 2025, Nutrition Services received USDA approval for statewide waivers for Happy Helpings sponsors to use during unanticipated school closures.

The waivers are available during unanticipated school closures when meal service operations are limited due to natural disasters, unscheduled major building repairs, court orders relating to school safety or other issues, labor-management disputes, or when approved by the state agency for similar unanticipated causes.

The following approved waivers are available when schools are closed with no virtual learning/classes:

- Non-Congregate Meal Service
- Parent and Guardian Meal Pick-up
- Meal Service Times
- Service of Meals at School Sites

The waivers listed above are available through June 30, 2026.

Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) sponsors may only serve meals in a non-congregate setting, adjust the time of meal service, allow parent pick up, and allow service of meals at non-school sites upon approval to use the waivers.



Waivers cannot be approved for more than 10 consecutive operating days without approval from the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS). In situations that may warrant longer approval periods, the FNS Southeast Regional Office (SERO) will work closely with Nutrition Services to determine if an extension is needed.

Happy Helpings Sponsors interested in applying for these waivers during unanticipated school closures must submit waiver requests via the Waiver Module in GA ATLAS. For questions, contact Melissa.Stanley@dec.al.ga.gov or Tammie.Baldwin@dec.al.ga.gov.

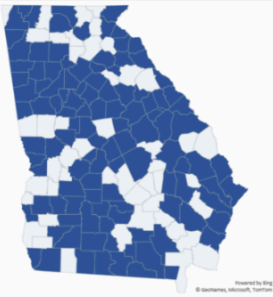

- **June 21 – Longest Day of Play**

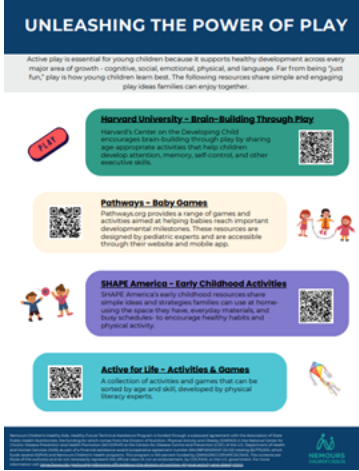
Here are some ideas for ways to celebrate:
