Dear Child Care Provider:

As part of the Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) Act of 2014, rules were adopted to help strengthen the foundation of health and safety for children in out-of-home environments. In October those rules went into effect in Georgia for all licensed child care programs. The revised rules require all staff with direct care responsibilities to complete Health & Safety Orientation training plus CPR & First aid training (if not currently certified). New staff members hired on or after October 1, 2016 must obtain the Health & Safety Orientation and CPR/First aid training within 90 days of employment. Staff that were hired before October 1, 2016 must complete the Health & Safety Orientation training and CPR and First Aid training (if not currently certified) by June 30, 2017.

DECAL is providing a free online module for the Health & Safety Orientation through Pennsylvania State University that is available now at <a href="http://extension.psu.edu/youth/betterkidcare/on-demand">http://extension.psu.edu/youth/betterkidcare/on-demand</a>. First, sign in to the On Demand option, and then choose the module called "Georgia Health and Safety Orientation Training (for Georgia child care providers only)". The new Health & Safety Orientation training:

- <u>does not</u> replace the initial staff orientation or first year training topics ("basic 6"), which are still required by the rules;
- only has to be completed one time (does not have to be renewed); and
- can be used toward meeting the requirement for annual training hours.

Note: Staff are encouraged to enter all completed training information in the Georgia Professional Development System (GA PDS).
