## MINDING YOUR 'P'S

Key Term	Definition
 <p><b>P</b>honological Awareness</p>	<p>The understanding that spoken language can be broken down into parts and the ability to manipulate those parts at the word, syllable, onset-rime, and phoneme level.</p>
 <p><b>P</b>honemic Awareness</p>	<p>The ability to notice, think about, and work with the individual sounds in spoken words.</p> <p>(Note the illustration does not include letters in example, but sounds)</p>
 <p><b>P</b>honeme</p>	<p>The smallest unit of sound in spoken words.</p> <p>Bat has three phonemes: /b/ /a/ /t/</p>
 <p><b>P</b>rint Knowledge</p>	<p>Knowing letter names, letter sounds, and concepts of print.</p>
 <p><b>P</b>honics</p>	<p>Using printed letters and letter-sound relationships to read words.</p>
