



Pre-K Payments



Pre-K Payments

- May 19: final day for payment disputes
 - Review your payment advice and confirm payments are correct.
 - If the payment does not reflect the reported roster data, a payment dispute should be submitted to panda.finance@decal.ga.gov.
- An example of a payment dispute is the lead teacher salary not calculating according to what was reported on the Pre-K roster.
- The dispute process is not intended to address lead teacher credential and/or CYE matters that should have been addressed/resolved prior to the last Pre-K payment.



Pre-K Payments

- Two additional payments in May.
 - Transportation: A payment for December May was processed on May 17th.
 - Benefits: A payment will be made by May 26th to local school system grantees for increased state health benefit rate for January-June. If you have questions, email <u>PreK@decal.ga.gov</u>



\$5,000 Classroom Grant Funding Reminder

- Classroom grant payments were paid through the PANDA system in October 2022.
- The funding must be expended for instructional materials, technology, approved Pre-K curricula, and furniture for use in the Pre-K classroom.
 - No prior approval required to purchase Pre-K curricula and items on the Georgia's Pre-K Program Basic Equipment, Materials and Supplies Inventory List. Contact your Pre-K Specialist for approval for items not included on the list.
- Tax and shipping for orders may be included in purchases.
- Funds must be spent, and goods received by June 30, 2023. Any funds not spent must be returned through the 2022-2023 Pre-K Year-End Reconciliation process.



\$5,000 NEW Classroom Grant Funding Reminder

- In April 2023, classroom grant payments were paid through the PANDA system to new classes awarded in the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school year.
- These funds are in addition to the classroom grant payments paid to programs in October 2022.
- The funding must be expended for instructional materials and technology for the new class.
 - Your Pre-K Specialist must approve purchases prior to purchase.
- Tax and shipping for orders may be included in purchases.
- Funds must be spent, and goods received by June 30, 2023. Any funds not spent must be returned to DECAL through the 2022-2023 Pre-K Year-End Reconciliation process.

Supporting Teachers



Requests for Teacher Credential Waivers

- Waiver Extension Request (Extension requests available now)
 - Providers with a waivered teacher who will not hold a qualifying credential by fall 2023 may now request a waiver extension if the teacher is pursuing an approved credential.
 - Waiver extension requests must be submitted online in PANDA.
- New Credential Waiver for 2023-2024 (New waiver application available in July)
 - The application to request a NEW credential waiver for the 2023-2024 school year is not available yet.
 - You may request a new credential waiver in July when the roster system is open for teacher data entry. Providers will be notified via email when the roster system is open.
- Steps for submitting credential waivers in PANDA are included in the Request for Waiver of Teacher Credential Instructions document posted on the Pre-K Project Directors webpage. If you have questions, email panda.teachers@decal.ga.gov.

CDA with CLASS Program



- DECAL, in partnership with Teachstone, is offering the CDA CLASS Facilitated program at no cost to participants.
- Program provides teachers with guidance and support to complete their required coursework and portfolio requirements, while learning ways to improve teacher-student interactions.
- Once participants finish the Teachstone training, they will be able to apply for DECAL Scholars to cover the observation/assessment fee. The CDA is completely free for those that meet the DECAL Scholars eligibility criteria.
- Great opportunity for teachers who do not hold an approved credential and are not currently enrolled in a credentialing program.
 - Assistant teacher who will not hold a qualifying credential by fall 2023
 - Lead teacher with a GaPDS verified non-ECE bachelor's degree who will not hold one of the add-on credentials listed in section 12.4 of Pre-K Guidelines by fall 2023




Work Sampling System

- All WSO Logins will be disabled on July 2nd. All 2022-2023 data will be removed to prepare the system for the 2023-2024 school year.
- Any 2022-2023 WSO year-end reports that you need for future use must be generated <u>before</u> the data is deleted on **July 2nd**.
- Administrator logins will be reinstated on August 7th.
- **Teacher** logins will be reinstated on **August 21st**. Start-up reminders will be sent to you and your teachers via email.



Feelings and Emotions Book Set



- To celebrate Georgia's Pre-K 30th birthday, each Georgia's Pre-K class received the Feelings and Emotions book set from Lakeshore Publishing.
- Each book focuses on a different emotion and can be used to help children recognize a variety of emotions and learn positive approaches to express their own feelings.

Pyramid Model Resource

- Pyramid model videos are available on the Pre-K Teacher webpage under the section entitled, "The Pyramid Model for Supporting Social Emotional Development in Young Children."
- Each of the brief videos features a component of the Pyramid Model kit and provides examples of it in use in a Georgia's Pre-K classroom.





Pyramid Model Training

- The <u>Pyramid Model</u> is a framework of evidencebased practices for promoting young children's healthy social and emotional development
- DECAL is utilizing federal recovery funds to provide Pyramid Model training to the early learning workforce
 - Directors/ Administrators/ Principals
 - Infant, Toddler, Preschool & Pre-K teachers
- Training will include online e-modules and professional learning community sessions



- DECAL will train approximately 1,000 educators by September 2024
 - 22 programs will participate in the pilot training series beginning in March
- Participants will receive a \$400 stipend and \$175 in Class Wallet funds to purchase Pyramid Model materials
- Child Trends is conducting an evaluation of the training series

- Increase funds to provide a \$2,000 cost-of-living adjustment for all full-time, benefit-eligible state employees (Pre-K State Staff)
- effective July 1, 2023, to address agency recruitment and retention needs = \$202,326
- Reflect an adjustment in Merit System Assessment billings = \$2,782
- Reduce formula funds for training and experience for Pre-K teachers=\$(178,981)
- Increase formula funds for classroom operations and redirect existing funding to Pre-K lead teacher salaries = \$14,035,636
- Increase funds to adjust the state base salary schedule to increase salaries for certified Pre-K teachers and assistant teachers by \$2,000
 = \$20,647,514
- Increase formula funds to reflect an increase in the employer contribution for State Health Benefit Plan (SHBP) from 18.534% to 29.454% of salary for certified lead employed public school Pre-K providers = \$8,179,906

FY 2024 Appropriation



SY 2024 Pre-K Budget: Salary

- Increase of \$2,000 per lead teacher and assistant teachers (all levels)
- 100% of salary for lead and assistant teachers required
 - Elimination of the 90% rule for lead teachers



SY 2024 Pre-K Budget: Operating

- Classroom Operating: Increase of \$3676.16 per classroom
- Classroom Benefits:
 - Increase of \$475.20 per teacher due to salary increase; total per class \$950.40
 - Increase in benefit rate for certified lead teachers in public schools
 - Health increased to 29.454%; total benefit rate increased to 50.884%



DECAL Legislative Update

House Working Group on Early Education

Focus on policies to expand access to Pre-Kindergarten.

HB 538 GA Early Literacy Act


Requires teachers in licensed childcare facilities to receive training on developmentally evidence-based literacy instruction.

SB211 GA Council on Literacy

Creates the Council to conduct a comprehensive review of birth to postsecondary literacy programs.







Study Findings




Georgia's Pre-K Evaluation Overview

- Funded by the Georgia General Assembly in 2011. DECAL commissioned FPG Child Development Institute at UNC-Chapel Hill to conduct the research.
- Evaluation includes three studies:
 - Pre-K Outcomes Study (2011-2012)
 - Regression Discontinuity Design Study (2012-2013)
 - Longitudinal Study (2013-2019)
- Overall, results from the three studies demonstrate positive impact of Georgia's Pre-K Program on school readiness skills across all learning domains.
- DECAL is releasing the final study report in May 2023



Study Timeline





Selected Findings

- Most within-grade gains were in Pre-K and 4th Grade.
- By 4th grade, children scored at or above the national average on six of the nine standardized assessments.
- Scores for the vocabulary measure have been below the national average throughout the study.
- Dual language learners were slightly below the national norm for language and literacy skills measured in English, and well below the national norm for skills measured in Spanish.
- Classroom quality was in the moderate to high range.
- More classrooms fell in the high-quality range in Pre-K than any other grade.
 - Less than 1% of Pre-K classes fell into the low range.



- A key strength of Georgia's Pre-K Program is building foundational language and literacy skills for reading.
- Vocabulary development is an area of growth for children ages birth to five, but also kindergarten to 4th grade.
- While classroom quality is highest in Pre-K, it is relatively consistent throughout the study.



Next Steps: Georgia's Pre-K Language Study

Research Questions:

- 1. What Pre-K practices and contextual factors support children's language skills in Georgia's Pre-K classrooms?
- 2. Is there variation in children's language experiences within classrooms?
- 3. Do student characteristics predict differences in language experiences?
- Sample: 146 classrooms and 663 children
