Food on the Farm Dance

Pig Roll: Have your child pretend to roll in the mud like a pig! You could do this outside on the grass. If inside, spread out a large blanket to represent a pigpen. Encourage your child to lie down and roll across.

Phonological Awareness

Discuss words that rhyme with pig. These can be actual words or nonsense words. (big, dig, fig, gig, jig, rig, wig) You can do this same activity with other animals or things you would see on the farm such as a cow or hay.

Literacy

Little Blue Truck by Alice Schertle is the story of a kind and helpful blue truck who with the help of the farm animals pushes a grumpy dump truck out of the mud.

After reading the book, discuss with your child ways to be a good friend like the Little Blue Truck.

Math

Many fruits and vegetables are grown on farms. Gather the fruits and vegetables you have in your home (real, canned, play food, or pictures). Sort them into two groups, fruits or vegetables. Count the number in each group and compare which has more/less. You can also have your child sort the food by colors and compare which has more/less.

Science and Fine Motor

Make Mud – Not a Mess!

Go outside and put about a cup of dirt in a plastic resealable bag. Add a little water to make mud and close the bag. Lay the bag down and have your child use his finger to write letters or numbers in the mud.
