Foundation Celebrates Finest of Georgia's Early Childhood Professionals at Chamber Event in Atlanta

Educators represent programs in Atlanta, Lincolnton, Marietta, Smyrna, and Watkinsville

Atlanta, GA. (May 2, 2025) – Today the Georgia Foundation for Early Care + Learning celebrated several categories of superlative early childhood professionals at a luncheon hosted by the Metro Atlanta Chamber of Commerce and sponsored by the Georgia Lottery Corporation, Primrose Schools Franchising Company LLC, MTX, and mavQ. The event recognized Georgia Educators of the Year (EoTY), Georgia's Pre-K Teachers of the Year (ToTY), and the Early Childhood Champion of the Year.

"These teachers lay the foundation for a lifetime of learning for the young children in their care. They support each child's unique needs and facilitate developmentally appropriate classroom activities that spark a lifelong love of learning. They are focused on each child's cognitive, social, and physical growth and prepare children to be successful as they enter Kindergarten.

Early Childhood EoTY and Georgia Pre-K ToTY Programs

The Georgia Early Childhood Education Educator of the Year recognizes outstanding early education teachers of children ages birth to preschool with an Infant Teacher of the Year (0-18 months), Toddler Teacher of the Year (15-36 months), and Preschool Teacher of the Year (36-48 months).

This year's Georgia Early Childhood Educators of the Year are:

- Zina Hadjaz from the Quadrilingual Academy in Smyrna (Infant)
- Laura Silva from My Little Geniuses in Marietta (Toddler)
- Samantha Mullins from Our House at Central in Atlanta (Preschool)

The Georgia Pre-K Teacher of the Year Program recognizes two educators of Pre-K students, one from a public school and one from a private program.

This year's Georgia Pre-K Teachers of the Year are:

- Rachel Robertson from Oconee Preschool Academy in Watkinsville (Pre-K Private School)
- Elizabeth Arthur from Lincoln County Elementary School in Lincolnton (Pre-K Public School)

The winner of each category received funds for their personal use and for a classroom makeover. Their schools also received funds to cover travel costs and expenses for substitute teachers when the awardees fulfill their duties as Georgia's EoTYs and Georgia Pre-K ToTYs.

The winners serve as ambassadors for their programs through activities related to modeling effective classroom practices and public speaking appearances – such as today's event.

Early Childhood Champion Award

The Foundation also awarded its second annual Early Childhood Champion Award to the Thomasville-Thomas County Chamber of Commerce (Chamber). Through its strategic initiatives and collaborative efforts, the Chamber has significantly contributed to expanding high-quality child care options in Thomasville, Georgia.

One of the Chamber's most impactful initiatives is Project Workforce, launched in 2023 in partnership with Imagine Thomasville, the Georgia Partnership for Excellence in Education (GPEE), and the Thomasville Community Resource Center (TCRC). This comprehensive workforce plan addresses critical areas in the birth-to-work pipeline, with a strong emphasis on early education and child care. By focusing on this foundational stage, the Chamber has laid the groundwork for a robust and sustainable workforce in the region.

The Chamber has also been instrumental in securing funding to expand child care services. The City of Thomasville Payroll Development Authority, in collaboration with the Chamber, received a DECAL EXPAND Grant to extend child care availability during non-traditional hours. This grant reflects the Chamber's proactive approach to addressing the evolving needs of families and businesses in the community.
